ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

#350 Fitchburg Turnpike is significant as one of Nine Acre Corner's 2 1/2-story, five-bay, eighteenth-century farmhouses. Here it displays the paired rear chimneys that had become prevalent by the 1770's. It has a two-story rear wing with a twentieth-century 1-story extension on its east end, and a two-story leanto on the west. Most of the house trim is intact, consisting of narrow corner boards and a boxed, molded cornice with no overhang at the gable ends. Windows are 6-over-6-sash. The main entry, with 2/3-length sidelights, narrow, paneled pilasters, and high frieze with projecting lintel, dates to the Greek Revival period. The foundation is dressed granite.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

This house appears to have been built just prior to the Revolution, for Francis and/or Noah Wheeler, of the large Wheeler family which had farmed much of the land in the Nine Acre Corner area since the seventeenth century. (Francis and Noah were half-brothers, sons of Francis Wheeler, and thus grandsons of William Wheeler, and great-grandsons of George Wheeler.) Francis, (1728-1778,) was apparently killed in the Revolution, but Noah, (1749-1834,) appears to have lived here until his death. The "N. Wheeler" shown here in 1852 is undoubtedly Noah's son, also Noah Wheeler, (b. 1778.)

The property had passed to George Wheeler by 1856. Alice Wheeler, George's wife, was one of the first women elected to the school committee in Concord. After George's death, his daughter Hattie (Harriet) Wheeler sold the property to Harry Brigham in 1905. After World War I it was owned first by Carlson and Pearson, then Pearson alone until sold to Leslie O. Anderson in 1929, who owned it until 1942. Through most of the 1940's the property was farmed by the d'Arrigo brothers.
